Duty

To act consistently with and seek to further the objects of the Pastoral Land Act, including to provide for the:

- ✓ sustainable use of land for pastoral purposes and the economic viability of the pastoral industry
- ✓ monitoring of pastoral land so as to detect and assess any change in its condition
- ✓ prevention or minimisation of degradation of or other damage to the land and its indigenous plant and animal life
- ✓ rehabilitation of the land in cases of degradation or other damage

The Northern Territory pastoral estate boasts a resilient land resource managed by a robust pastoral industry and championed by a proactive Pastoral Land Board
