Your career as an officer in the Environmental Regulation team in the Northern Territory Government is about to take off. We regulate everything from contaminated land and landfills to the container deposit scheme as well as major industries such as the onshore gas and mining industries. WHAT YOU NEED

All our positions require you to hold a degree in environmental science, engineering, law, forensic science, auditing or a related field. Three different levels are available and your training and practical experience will inform the most appropriate position for you.

THE POSITIONS

We have numerous exciting opportunities within our team.

Environmental Officer (P1 and P2 roles)

- Our entry level or graduate positions (Professional 1 or P1 officers) are ideal for recent graduates or those with limited regulatory experience. You will be willing and able to learn about environmental regulation and how to correctly apply statutory instruments and policies when you start your journey with us.
- Experienced Environmental Officers

 (Professional 2 or P2 officers) are ideal for
 those that have a more detailed understanding
 of and familiarity with environmental
 regulatory frameworks. Our more experienced
 environmental officers are comfortable
 using regulatory tools, such as licences and
 other statutory instruments, undertaking
 investigations, and have proven experience in a
 generic or specialised role such as environmental
 assessment, environmental management (e.g. air,
 water, contaminated land, waste) environmental
 auditing, environmental compliance and
 enforcement, regulatory investigations or
 development of regulatory guidance material.

Senior Environmental Officer (P3 roles)

 Senior Environmental Officers (Professional 3 or P3 officers) are the key leadership roles in our division. Senior Environmental Officers have significant experience in environmental regulation, the interpretation and application of legislation, and are able to undertake complex investigations and support the preparation of prosecutorial briefs. Our Senior Environmental Officers enjoy mentoring and guiding junior staff in the regulatory craft.

Environmental regulators are at the heart of Territory life. We enable businesses by giving them clear rules and guidance around how they should operate in the Territory. We also take action where there is non-compliance with the rules to ensure the Territory's precious environment is protected now and into the future.

Working with us will expose you to a wide range of industries and challenging problems to solve. Our regulators gain experience in pollution and contaminated land, waste management, landfills and illegal dumping, mining and on-shore gas production, air pollution and marine pollution. We drive outcomes that supports the Territory's transition to a circular economy.

You will gain experience working across the whole regulatory spectrum, from assessment and approvals at one end, to compliance monitoring and enforcement at the other. This also means investigations and preparing matters for prosecution.

EXPERIENCE THE WHOLE OF THE NORTHERN TERRITORY
